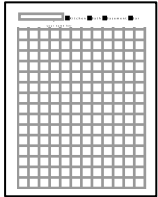

Step By Step Countertop Measuring Instructions

Tools



Pencil or Pen



Measurement Tape

Use the worksheet (downloaded from site) to draw a simple sketch of your kitchen or bath countertops.

Measure your countertop in inches, using a regular tape measure. Note where sink(s), appliance and walls are located. Complete all of the 5 Steps listed in "Sketching Your Countertops". See example (shown) of what your final sketch should look like.

Measuring Countertop Tips

Existing Countertop:

- Step A - Measuring Length: measure along the wall from one edge to the opposite edge.
- Step B - Measuring Width: measure from the back wall to the finished front edge.
- * If your existing countertop has a backsplash, be sure to factor in the thickness.

New Cabinetry:

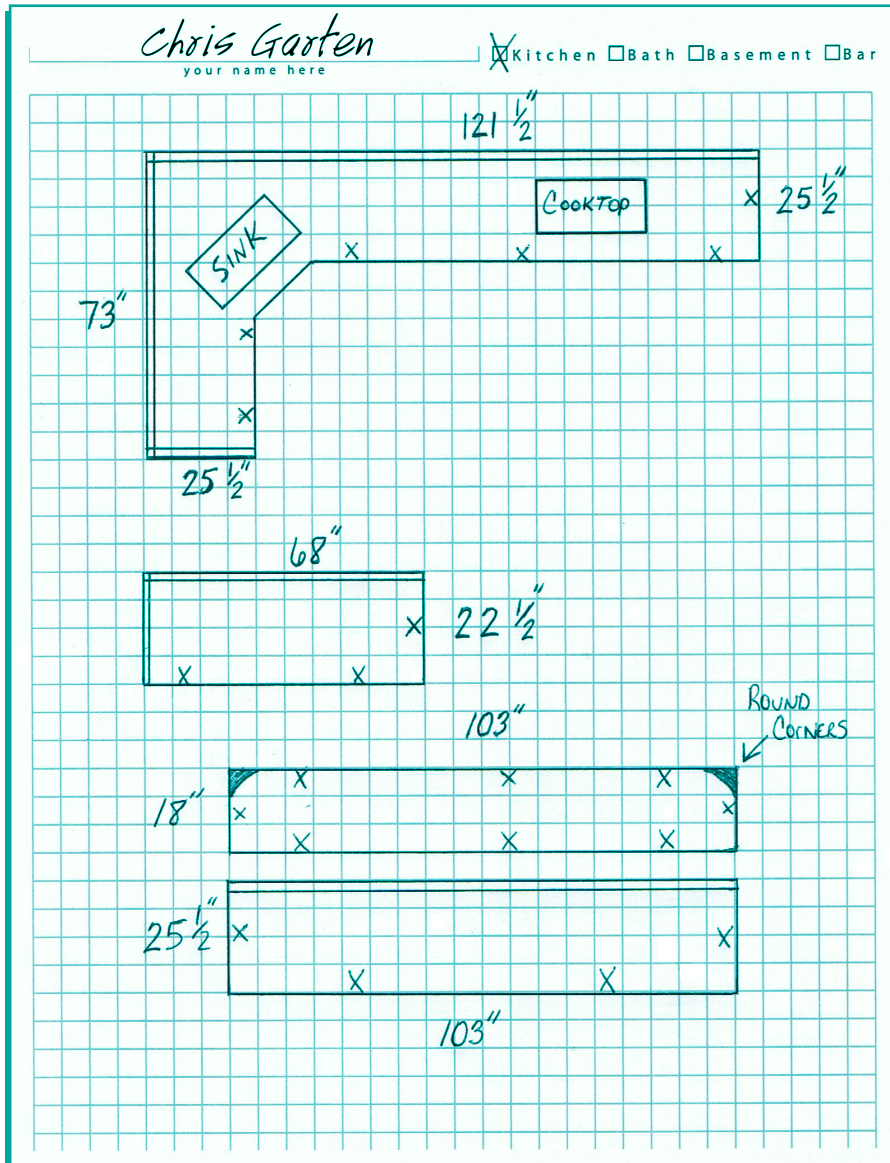
- Step A - Measuring Length: Measure along the wall from one edge to the opposite edge.
- Step B - Measuring Width - Measure from the back wall to the front of the cabinet.

Sketching Your Countertops

1. Sketch out the basic shape of your room layout and label walls.
2. Mark sink location and indicate type of sink (Drop-in or Undermount).
3. Mark stove location and indicate type of stove: (Slide-in Cooktop or Drop-in Cooktop).
4. Mark with an (x) all exposed edges that will need to be finished.
5. Indicate any area on the plan that is not granite, such as wall ovens, pantry area, refrigerator area, butcher block table, etc...

Islands:

Note: Every rounded piece (including curves) should be measured as if it were rectangular in shape. Measure the furthest distance possible from the rounded side to the opposite side.
